During the second session, the students of III B.A. History visited Brahadeeshwara Temble, Thanjavur. Prof. Dr. Govindarajanar Deiva Nayagam, Thanjavur explained about the Structure, art and architecture, sculpture, Inscription of the big temple in the II session of this Programme.

Outcomes:

The 29 students' participated in this programme and learnt that the original monuments of this 11th century temple were built around a moat. It included gopura, the main temple, its massive tower, inscriptions, frescoes and sculptures predominantly related to Shaivism, but also of Vaishnavism and Shaktism traditions of Hinduism. The temple was damaged in its history and some artwork is now missing. Additional mandapam and monuments were

added in centuries that followed. The temple now stands amidst fortified walls



that were added after the 16th century. The students learnt about the art and architecture, sculpture and inscriptional works and History of Brihadishvara Temple.

SECOND DAY - I SESSION

Date : 27.11.219

Venue: Maratha Palace, Thanjavur.



On 27.11.2019 the students of III B.A. History visited Maratha Palace of Thanjavur. They know about the Structure, sculpture, Inscription, art and architecture of the Maratha palace in I session of this Programme.

Outcomes:

The students understand about the Thanjavur Maratha palace was originally constructed by the rulers of Thanjavur Nayak kingdom. After the fall of the Thanjavur Nayak kingdom, it served as the official residence of the



Thanjavur Maratha. When most of the Thanjavur Maratha kingdom was annexed by the British Empire in 1799, the Thanjavur Marathas continued to hold sway over the palace and the surrounding fort. The Bhonsle family continued to hold on to the palace even after the last king Shivaji II. The students should learn the information about old things rare book, painting, status of Serfoji, Art and Architecture style of Maratha, Museum etc.

SECOND DAY - II SESSION

Date : 27.11.219

Venue : Saraswathi Mahal Library, Thanjavur

On 27.11.2019 the students of III B.A. History visited Saraswathi Mahal Library, Thanjavur. They know the importance of the old books, Structure, sculpture, Inscription, art and architecture of the Saraswathi Mahal Library, Thanjavur in the II session of this Programme.



Outcomes:

The Students known about the Saraswathi Mahal library was started by



Nayak Kings of Tanjavur as a Royal Library for the private intellectual enrichment of Kings and their family of Thanjavur who ruled from 1535 CE till 1676 CE. The Maratha rulers who captured Thanjavur in 1675 promoted local culture and further developed the Royal Palace

Library until 1855. Most notable among the Maratha Kings was Serfoji II who was an eminent scholar in many branches of learning and the arts. In his early

age Sarfoji studied under the influence of the German Reverent Schwartz, and learned many languages including English, French, Italian and Latin..

During 1918 the Saraswathi Mahal Library was open to public. The Library is located within the campus of Tanjavur palace.

THIRD DAY

On 28.11.2019 the students of History visited Ш B.A. Tamil University Museum at Thanjavur. Dr. A. Raja., Director, Department of Museum, Tamil University, explained about Thanjavur the storage of the ancient historical objects and the maintenance of Museum in this Programme.

Outcomes:

The students learn about the Tamil University Museum at Thanjavur in

the state of Tamil Nadu is an important museum for its storage of the ancient historical objects. It was established in the **year 1983** as a multipurpose museum. Objects that are exhibited in the museum for the visitors to look upon



include cultural objects, replicas of Indus Valley, tools of beads, burial urns, inscriptions on stone in Tamil and Marathi, coins, sculptures, bronze images, wood carvings, arms, models of contemporary paintings, Chellinar house, utensils and knives.
