

Research Culture

The promotion of a culture of research among students can actively be observed in College. In addition to syllabus-based learning, students are always encouraged to undertake research projects formed out of their own observations and questions. Students of postgraduate courses are provided syllabus-based classes on research methodology in order to aid them in their research. They are expected to submit a well-researched dissertation, on which they are rigorously examined.

For the promotion of research in College, many concessions are extended, particularly through seed grants to faculty submitting proposals. Additional support from College towards research includes the reimbursement of travel and registration expenses for staff attending conferences and workshops, availability of leave for faculty, and infrastructural support in terms of electricity, water, office space, equipment and internet for researchers.

The faculty have published articles in UGC-listed national and international Journals, apart from contributions to Books or Conference Proceedings. Faculty members regularly attend international and national conferences, seminars and workshops where they present their research findings and benefit from interactions with eminent Resource Persons and fellow-researchers.
